- Note that course content and availability at your host university may change; Go Global cannot guarantee access to specific courses or whether available courses will meet your degree requirements
- This plan will **not** be used for your actual course registration at your host university.

## Not sure where to start?

- Check your Degree Navigator or speak with an Advisor in your faculty to determine the best time to go on Exchange:
  - o which credits do you still need to fulfill (e.g. requirements, electives...)
  - o when are your degree required courses offered at UBC? (e.g. only offered in term 1)
- Review the Partner University Pages for institutions you're interested in to:
  - o connect to the partner's website and find out what courses are typically offered
  - verify the credit equivalency ratio to determine how the partner credits will transfer back to UBC
  - o use the Transfer Credit Search Portal to see examples of previous courses other UBC students have transferred back from exchange
- On the partner university's own course website:
  - o note that course catalogues for your term abroad might not be published yet; choose potential courses from the most recent listings
  - o look for courses that are open to exchange students
  - o remember to check the language of instruction
  - o check the level of the course and if there are any pre-requisites
- Review the exchange Transfer Credit Process for your UBC campus (Vancouver or Okanagan) to understand how your exchange credits transfer back to UBC:
  - o depending on the course content, courses you take on exchange can transfer back as equivalent to a specific UBC course (e.g. PSYC 331), unassigned credit at the department level (e.g. PSYC 3<sup>rd</sup>), unassigned credit at the faculty level (e.g. ARTS 1st) or Elective credit (ELEV 1st).
  - note relevant deadlines for initiating review of your courses for transfer credit
