| Preparing to arrive | |

| | Read through the <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u> on the VIRS website. |
| | Pay your <u>IMED Fees</u> on the UBC <u>Student Service Centre</u> . |
| | Apply for relevant immigration documents (eTA, Visitor Visa or Study Permit). |
| | VIRS students at UBC for longer than 6 months will require a study permit. Please read the <u>Study Permit Tutorial</u> . |
| | Contact UBC's <u>International Student Advising</u> if you have questions at <u>isa@students.ubc.ca</u> . Identify yourself as a VIRS student and include your UBC ID number, your citizenship and the number of months of your VIRS stay. |
| | Plan your travels to Vancouver. |
| | Begin to consider your <u>housing options</u> . |
| | Inform Go Global and your host supervisor if you will be delayed arriving or if there are any changes to your research dates. |
| | If your visa or study permit is refused, please contact Go Global immediately. We may be able to support you in applying again. |
| | Plan your first day and your research schedule with your host supervisor |
| | Join the <u>VIRS Facebook Group</u> to meet other VIRS students. |
| | Register for a <u>VIRS orientation session.</u> |

| When you arrive at UBC | |
| | Find and print your IMED Card from your email from David Cummings Insurance (search DCIS). |
| | Apply for IMED Date-change: most students will need to do this when they arrive. |
| | Apply for <u>BC MSP</u> immediately upon arrival (all students staying for longer than 6 months). |
| | Get your UBC Card from the <u>UBC Bookstore</u> . This is your UBC ID card and your library card. Remember to bring your passport. |
